Lander County is a prosperous, outdoor oriented county of approximately six thousand residents. The economy is based primarily on ranching, farming, mining and support businesses. Battle Mountain, Lander County seat, is centrally located on Interstate 80. Lander County and Battle Mountain have an exciting and rich history. Lander County is an important element in Nevada's struggling economy providing strong employment numbers and significant mining-based tax revenue. Our community enjoys plentiful and stable employment opportunities through local mining operations and services. This translates into a median household income of nearly \$80,000.

Nevada has unlimited room to grow, explore, with a lifestyle which blends the best of recreation and enterprise.

Battle Mountain is in the center of Nevada's thriving mining economy which means growth, employment and income levels that are some of the best in Nevada. Agriculture also plays a significant role in the local economy. High quality alfalfa and alfalfa seed is produced and shipped throughout the West. Austin and Kingston straddle the Toiyabe Mountain Range and are rich in history and outdoor recreation.

Located in north central Nevada, Lander County encompasses 5,621 square miles. Over 85 percent of the County is currently public land managed by federal agencies, making hunting and fishing, hiking and mountain biking abundant. South of Battle Mountain, the new Shoshone Off-highway Vehicle Trail System takes four-wheelers through stunning desert and mountain landscapes. The wide open basin and range territory makes Lander County a true sportsmen's paradise.

Lander County sports numerous cultural amenities such as the Battle Mountain Cookhouse Museum, St Augustine's Cultural Center, Hickison Petroglyphs, mining ghost towns and Austin, a stop on the Pony Express Trail and the Loneliest Road in America. It is one the nation's best examples of a preserved mining town; once home to more than 10,000 fortune seekers.

Community events are a part of the fabric. Lander County claims fame to celebrations and events which include: the World Human Powered Speed Challenge, Annual Basque Dinner and Dance, community Christmas Celebration, 4th of July Festival, Battle Mountain Burners Show N Shine, wine walks in Austin and Battle Mountain, Chukar Tournament and Feed, Lincoln Highway Car Show, the Austin Live Nativity and Kingston Christmas Village.
